GREENHOUSE RESTORED THANKS TO SKILLED TEAMWORK EFFORTS

On September 2, 2025, severe Santa Ana winds caused tree damage throughout the campus. Large limbs dropped from two eucalyptus trees, each over 70 years old, resulting in significant damage to an Agricultural Operations greenhouse. One tree broke through the roofs of five rooms in the greenhouse and destroyed the main truss.

Mark Jones, the campus arborist and irrigation landscape supervisor, organized an emergency response to remove the fallen branches. His team, including tree trimmer **Richard Bado** and grounds worker **Erik Gutierrez**, worked diligently for two days to clear the debris from the roof, ensuring immediate safety and access.

Ryan McGinnis, Lead Sheet Metal Welder, and his team, including **Daniel Mendez** and **Laszlo Nemeth**, undertook extensive repair work after the storm. The project required over three months of planning, including

renting heavy lifting equipment such as a boom lift and scaffolding.

Over three solid weeks, Ryan and his team meticulously restored the greenhouse structure, fabricating most parts by hand while outsourcing only the plastic corrugated roofing and side paneling. They repaired everything to how it was originally installed by the manufacturer.

The main eucalyptus tree was deemed a safety hazard after inspection, and the decision was made to remove all three trees, which had a history of limb failures.

Hats off to Ryan and his skilled sheet metal team for their exceptional work in restoring the greenhouse, as well as their collaboration with the landscape team.

The 'Go-Live' date was successfully achieved on February 2, transitioning from paper tracking to the FAMIS 360 mobile app for inventory requests. Clearing out and reorganizing the building was a significant effort, and their leadership was crucial to this success.

Attention Technicians: To streamline your workflow, please plan and identify your material needs in advance.

The warehouse shopping hours are **Monday through Friday from 8 AM to 9 AM and 1 PM to 2 PM**. During these hours, you can use the FAMIS 360 mobile app to create your shopping cart while in the warehouse. Once you've

completed your shopping, an ASSET team member will check out your items and issue the materials directly to your work order in FAMIS 360.

For those shopping outside of business hours, specifically from 4:30 PM to 5:30 AM, you will report the shopping cart number in the Smartsheet using the QR scan upon exiting the warehouse.
